Welcome: Meeting call to order by Essence Wilson at 9:06 AM.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

**Approval of October minutes: Correction:** A request was made for the CoC October minutes to notate the extended timing of October's CoC meeting. The extended time resulted in unanticipated absences from agencies with conflicting schedules. Rollcall voting began far after the scheduled meeting end time of 10:30 AM.

**Governance Council Update:** Angela Hood-Beaugard provided the link for the Flint Genesee County CoC Governance YouTube page which provides all of the previous Governance Charter meeting sessions for anyone who wants to review the topics discussed. Also, a link of the updated Governance Charter draft will be sent shortly as well. Essence stated that there is an upcoming Governance Charter session on Friday, November 12<sup>th</sup> on the topic of Performance Evaluation, Accountability and Continuity.

Essence stated that November 22<sup>nd</sup> is the date that the Governance Council anticipates to account all of the changes based on the comments heard up to date. A townhall will be held to discuss the final review of the draft potentially on December 1<sup>st</sup> and the Governance Charter would be voted on by the general CoC membership on December 8<sup>th</sup> (at the December CoC meeting) to take effect January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022. As such the Governance Council will utilize the first quarter of 2022 to focus on implementation work. Housing Assessment and Recovery Agency (HARA): Please view report. Any questions regarding the HARA report can be sent to Misty Bowers at mbowers@ccsgc.org. Misty gave an update regarding Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV) Vouchers: She stated Erik Soderberg from BECKA Management emailed her a list of about 87 vouchers that BECKA Management is still willing to work with despite being recently expired or set to expire soon. Misty stated

that she and the HARA case managers have been working alongside BECKA Management. She also stated that the HARA HCV case manager, Lisa Gonzalez, has been a successful community referral in helping individuals and families find secure housing.

**GCCARD:** There was a request made for a GCCARD representative to be present on the CoC calls for report presentation purposes. There was also a request made for the CERA report information of HARA and GCCARD to be merged into a singular report.

HMIS Agency Administrator: David Tweedie stated that he is seeing a reduction in homelessness in Genesee County, but this is possibly due to data clean-up and it being the new fiscal year. He stated that in August 26 people were housed but now the number of people getting housed is on a decline month by month. The discussion ensued regarding the issues of contacting hard to reach clients for referrals and clients that are temporarily self-resolving their homelessness. Agencies such as GHS and Catholic Charities have many housing referrals returned to the Coordinated Entry specialist due to not being able to get ahold of clients that have self-resolved after several months. A breakdown on the 140 individuals on the QBNL shows that 90% of those clients exiting are self-resolving by temporarily moving in with friends and family. It is also worth noting that there is not as much adequate secure housing available in Genesee County. Essence stated that as a collective we need to collect this information so we can be advocates through sources such as City of Flint. This community-specific information/data can assist us with better understanding how we use funding such as homeless prevention funding, homeless diversion funding, etc. David stated that this is a huge opportunity for homelessness prevention and diversion to provide wrap-around services and figure out when clients exit shelters how to give them the support needed so they do not return to homelessness. Supplemental Social Security Income & Social Security Disability Insurance Outreach Access and Recovery (SOAR): Bill Doub stated they have had three approvals and MDHHS will give him the exact number of how much money and resources were generated for the city of Flint. One SOAR approval was a veteran, the other was a permanent supportive housing client approval and the last approval was a GHS client. The goal is to submit the draft by Friday, November 12<sup>th</sup>.

**Vote:** Tracey wanted a vote for approval of the FY-2021 CoC Program Consolidated Application components. The vote will instead go out on Friday, November 12<sup>th</sup> so the community will have more of an opportunity in reviewing

the 74-page application. The vote will be conducted through Microsoft Outlook and sent through Microsoft Outlook's poll feature; the voting deadline will be that Friday at noon.

# FY 2021 HUD CoC Program NOFO:

In the role of Collaborate Applicant, Tracey Jackson, gave an overview of the Prioritization meeting and presented the FY-2021 NOFO applicants for presentation and a "Q&A" segment. The presenting applicants and agencies were:

YWCA- Trina Sanders
Voices for Children-Sarah Zyburt
My Brother's Keeper-Debra Hayes
Catholic Charities-Vicky Schultz

The deadline for prioritization to be completed is Sunday, October 17<sup>th</sup>.

Tracey stated when the Flint Genesee County local NOFO competition was released, after reviewing the entire application with David Tweedie, she called the Tier 1 subrecipients and asked if there were anything they would want to change or if they choose to go forward with programming. Also, the "Intent to Apply" letter was received by all applicants, which included four new applicants. Tracey also reached out to make sure applicants knew they had support. She facilitated weekly NOFO Office hour calls to answer questions and talk about whatever the applicants wanted to discuss.

Data was collected from multiple HUD programs: SAGE (Annual Performance Reviews (APRs)), HMIS ServicePoint's ART system, eLOCCS, and HUD Data Exchange 1.0 and 2.0 (HDX). The data was then plugged into the HUD Rating and Ranking tool. Tracey explained how the information flows from the first tab of the tool all the way through the Ranking (it is built into the document). She also noted that applicants submitted their applications along with attachments (such as the Sam document, match verification letter, 501c3 verification etc.) on time, so subsequently they moved forward in the Prioritization process.

In concluding that discussion, a vote was facilitated for the community to accept, reject or reduce new programs. The following projects were accepted: a) VFC DV SSO 2021 (Voices for Children, b) MBK CE NAV SOSO 2021 (My Brother's Keeper); c) YWCA RRH DV 2021 (YWCA) and the following project was rejected CC CM SSO 2021 (Catholic Charities) due to duplication of services of the CE SSO grant vs. expansion. The question was asked if Catholic Charities could submit a new application. Tracey stated that she would ask the question on the HUD NOFO call to get clarity concerning submitting a new project after the deadline. Tracey conveyed that it was imperative for her to focus on the second step of the NOFO submission. The goal is to provide a copy of the HUD NOFO Application to the community by November 10<sup>th</sup> with a goal to submit to HUD on November 12<sup>th</sup>. She stated she will send out to the CoC a final ranking that will reflect the voting results [attached]. Motions were seconded and passed to forward the four projects, move the new projects from tier 1 to tier 2, accept the ranking results and approve the rank order.

Tracey explained that only the Collaborative Applicant can submit the NOFO and there are two Supportive Services projects (SSO) for the community; Coordinated Entry and Homeless Outreach. Three of the applicants are applying for new projects that will be an extension of the existing Coordinated Entry. Tracey explained that Coordinated Entry can be moved to another agency, but it is a program process that involves operating procedures from the Governance Charter, the Strategic Plan, the Continuous Quality Improvement subcommittee, and the Independent Review Team that can bring together data and program evaluations, so as a community one can open a request for proposal for Coordinated Entry to any subrecipient. However, we must keep in mind that this application is "all or nothing" as we are competing with other CoCs across the country.

**Voting:** The unanticipated extended timing of the meeting led to absences from agencies who were present initially but exited before the rollcall voting portion due to conflicting schedules. Rollcall voting began far after the scheduled meeting's end time of 10:30 AM.






# **NOVEMBER 2021 HMIS-REPORTED HOMELESSNESS INFLOW AND OUTFLOW**

Sustainability issues for clients "Revolving Door" of homelessness for clients

- Bill Doub stated that the client's decision-making process in terms of their securing stable housing needs to be tracked and documented. Chronic issues affecting stability, sustainability and cycling in and out of system can be a symptom of a severe and persistent mental illness/cause for concern. Refer those clients to the Behavioral Health Center at Genesee Health System.
- As part of the SOAR documentation process, tracking an individual's symptoms over time is critical to establishing if the client/claimant has a chronic disabling condition.
- Some factors that can play into lack of housing sustainability for clients can be depression, fear, substance abuse, financial insecurity, or lack of basic living skills. As such, these symptoms and behavior may be indicative of a chronic condition.
- The good news is housing navigators should be coming through the pipeline soon through the submitted CoC NOFO application funding process. The proposal has been put forth to have these Navigators participate in the SOAR On-Line training.
- Also make sure the clients, whom you are helping through SOAR process, get referred to Michigan Rehabilitation Services so they can get screened and tested (this is important in the SOAR process). If MRS can assist client with job readiness, this has to be established for Social Security to determine if a claimant is able or not able to work.
- In terms of additional client life-skill resources and case management resources,
   Travis discussed various options that shelters should have available for clients
  - Callers on the line such as Misty B, Teresa L, Gloria P, Richard P and others requested more information
  - Clients can also be referred to GHS and its provider network for mental health treatment and supportive services related to life-skill development and housing stability.
