I. WELCOME— Essence Wilson welcomed the Flint-Genesee County Continuum of Care members back from holiday break, then recited the mission. "A community working together to achieve access to safe and affordable housing for all residents of Genesee County." Essence asked the CoC members to take a moment and look at last month's meeting minutes and check their attendance, so we can ensure that records are correct.

II. OLD BUSINESS:

- A. January 2023 minutes were approved.
- B. Governance Council update—Essence shared a conversation that she had with Attorney Kelly Bidleman and her concern that people are not using the homeless court program. She stated that there have been many folks who have worked hard to make sure that we have that resource in our community, and a lot of work went into it. The program is a great program. Everybody has agreed to that, but for some reason there was a lower utilization than what was expected. Essence informed the group that out of their conversation, they recognize that maybe the intervention was taking place at the wrong point, that a crisis in a shelter was maybe not the best place for it. And so, we thought about who would be able to better support individuals on the QBNL.

Essence says the conversation evolved, and there was an application on the behalf of the CoC to GHS for a Housing Navigator that can hopefully provide some additional support to individuals on the QBNL while they're waiting on housing resources to connect them to additional opportunities, including homeless court, including employment, accessing benefits connecting with SOAR and other programs. The agency that would host that position has not been determined. If the grant is awarded, then that would come before the CoC and there would be an opportunity for agencies that think they are best positioned to support in that way would have an opportunity to make their case and it would be voted on by the CoC.

- C. Nominating Committee—Denise Diller explained the Governance Council's (GC) slate of nominees that are to be voted on for approval. The slate is made up of 4 people who are currently on the Governance Council and would like to remain on the GC, and we have 2 additional people who have signed up to join the GC.
 - 1. Governance Council Slate was Approved.

III. NEW BUSINESS:

- A. ESG Funding 2023—Damon Fortney introduced himself and his coworker Anthony Kelly. He explained that Anthony will now be taking over on the ESG side of things. Damon went over ESG funding for 2023. He explained applications received and if they met requirements to receive money. Damon informed the group that the Executive Committee (EC) has recommended that he brings this to the full CoC body to request approval.
 - 1. ESG Funding 2023 was Approved.

IV. REPORTS:

- A. Housing Assessment and Resource Agency: Please view HARA report. Misty stated that for the month of January, Catholic Charities had 3,427 incoming calls and 462 walk-ins. The homeless prevention program spent \$4874.15 and assisted 8 people. The Rapid Re-housing program spent \$7,124 and assisted 5 people. The Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program has 318 people on the waitlist. The Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) program has 14 names on the EHV waitlist. The Outreach program is out of funding. The CERA (COVID Emergency Rental Assistance) program at Catholic Charities is not financially assisting for the COVID Emergency Rental Assistance program. However, they are doing referrals to GCCARD and in 2 weeks we sent over 50 referrals.
 - **GCCARD** -- The CERA (COVID Emergency Rental Assistance) program at GCCARD spent \$515,704.63 on rent and utilities.
- **B.** Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI): No report submitted. The goal of the CQI is to determine and implement the best practice for an effectively functioning coordinated entry system. This committee is currently reviewing performance objectives. Meetings are 3rd Thursday at 1:00pm via ZOOM.
 - C. Street Outreach: Jim Perlaki reported 11 requests for homeless verifications in January 2023. Nine of those were verified homeless. A total of 230 adults and youth were served this reporting period. The outreach team provided the neighborhood with about 150 emergency needs items. The outreach team was also actively involved with PIT count.
 - **D.** Coordinated Entry System (CES): Please view CES report. Eric Cooper stated that he received 99 CESA forms in the month of December. Eric sent out 12 referrals and 5 people were housed.
 - **E. HMIS:** Please review HMIS report. The HMIS Administrators meeting is held on the first Thursday of the month at 11AM via ZOOM. All agencies who have a signed QSOBAA should participate in HMIS meetings.

- F. Supplemental Social Security Income & Social Security Disability Insurance Outreach Access and Recovery (SOAR): Please view SOAR report. If interested in becoming a SOAR practitioner, please contact Bill Doub for more information at (810) 618-6045 or wdoub@genhs.org. SOAR training can be done in a group cohort or individually. The monthly SOAR meetings are held via ZOOM on the 3rd Thursday of every month at 10am.
- **G. Fiscal Reports:** The Fiscal Work Group Subcommittee has restarted. Meetings are held via ZOOM on the 4th Thursday of every month at 10 AM. Moving forward the Fiscal Work Group Chairperson will produce a report and what was discussed will be reported out at the next CoC monthly meeting.

V. OTHER BUSINESS:

- A. PIT count debrief—Erika Humphrey informed the group that PIT Count 2023 went well. Community support was Awesome. Thank you to all the volunteers. Please return all PIT Count paperwork to Travis by March 1st.
- B. Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)—Tracey Hurd stated that she has contacted those that have RRH (Rapid Re-Housing) and PSH (Permanent Supportive Housing) and asked them to have a meeting to look at the SOP manual that we put together last year. We will add, delete, and collaborate on what SOP's look like for our county. We want to have continuity across all of our programming.
- C. Strategic Planning—Tracey Hurd reported that in December a very healthy discussion was had about strategic priorities. A follow-up meeting will be scheduled to determine how we want to choose our top 3 priorities out of the top 10 priorities discovered. We will then determine what funding we are going to pursue.

- C. **Observations, Comparisons/Trends**: For the month of February, the number of clients on the QBNL increased with more singles than families. CE received fewer CESA's and sent out less referrals in February than January. We are still experiencing a significant increase in clients from the Warming Center which opened 12/1. Clients who receive vouches continue to have difficulties finding suitable and affordable housing. All in all, this was a productive month for CE and we look forward to continuing great service to our communities.

Open and Welcome—Bill Doub

1. Goals:

- b. **Long term**: Establish a network of SOAR trained staff and SOAR Stakeholders to assist SHP housing recipients and other vulnerable individuals with applying for benefits.

- a. **Quantitative**: 1) Increase the number of approvals for clients receiving Federal, State, and local benefits; 2) increase the number of SOAR Trained staff assisting SHP clients with applying for benefits. 3) Increase the amount of dollars returned to the County as a direct benefit utilizing SOAR.
- b. **Qualitative**: Establishment of a network of SOAR Trained Cadre to assist individual clients with applying for Federal and State benefits.
- **3. Results:** One Approval resulting from a referral from the Greater Flint Health Coalition. Sixteen claims using SOAR process, Consent to Release Information and methodology are in process.

- From Zuzanna: Getting medical records have not been easy.
- **From Bill:** If you need help getting medical records; get a signed Release Of Information that includes Genesee Health Systems and he can help.
- From Bill: FYI...When a medical records department sees "social security" attached to a request they're going to ask you to pay. Bill suggests using "coordination of care".
- **From Bill:** Your client can go with you to the hospital and request records through patient portal.
- From Alisha: A lot of DDS examiners have had their phone numbers changed. Download the new list that was provided.
