I. WELCOME—Essence started the meeting by welcoming the CoC members and stating the CoC's mission. "A community working together to achieve access to safe and affordable housing for all residents of Genesee County.

II. COMMUNITY PRESENTATION

- A. LSEM Jill Nylander of Legal Services of Eastern Michigan presented the To Life Real Estate Investors impact on the community and the Flint/Genesee County CoC.
 - 1. An issue has arisen in the last 2 months relating to the Genesee County bundle sale of 120 properties for \$1.2 million dollars. These properties were foreclosed due to delinquent taxes last year. Genesee County has historically bundled those properties in a group for sale. What was unique about this year was they actually had an out of state investor place a bid on this package of properties. Most of these people are owners and not renters.
 - 2. To Life Real Estate sent out notices to all of them saying that they needed to contact them by a certain date in order to work out arrangements going forward. We do not see that there's a whole lot of grounds legally for disqualifying the purchase who presented to us directly.
 - 3. The first wave of evictions have now started. It was our understanding that about 40 of these had been filed in early November. We expect by now to start seeing some summons and complaints filed to try and evict these residents and going forward we will look at some education and outreach about the fact that a lot of these homeowners might be eligible for exemptions in terms of paying off the taxes.

III. OLD BUSINESS

- A. November 2023 minutes were approved.
- B. **Governance Council update** Essence Wilson: So, the Governance Council met, and we will continue to do our work. The big agenda before are the Infrastructure Organization and Collaborative Applicant RFP responses.

- 1. A communication was sent out indicating the IRT is currently deliberating and that their recommendation will come before the GC and the general membership in January.
- C. Infrastructure and Coordinated Entry RFP Update— The Coordinated Entry RFP has not been released. Due to the holidays the RFP may be released at the first of the year to give those who are interested in applying to submit their proposals without having to contend with the holiday season.
- D. **Nominating Committee:** The eligible agencies voted to nominate the current Class B members in the GC for another term.

IV. NEW BUISINESS

A. **2024 Considerations:** Tracey Hurd introduce next year's considerations to the CoC. There are 6 areas that we need to consider in 2024. The 6 areas are Entry Point, Prevention, housing, Sustainability, Data and Rapport Building

V. OTHER BUSINESS

- A. Point-In-Count (PIT) Update: Erika Humphrey gave an update for PIT Count.
 - 1. Our First PIT Count meeting will be this Friday on the 15th. Email me or Aaron if you if you did not receive the invite. January 31st is the official PIT Count date.
- B. **RFP Strategic Planning Update:** Tracey Hurd advised the entire CoC the RFP Strategic Planning will go out the first week in January.
- C. **Sub-Recipient Monitoring Update:** The first monitoring date is scheduled for tomorrow and Friday. They have all been scheduled.
- D. **Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) Vote**: The eligible agencies voted to approve the SOP. The vote passed.

VI. REPORTS

- A. **Housing Assessment Resource Agency:** Misty Bowers presented the HARA report for the month of October. So, I am still hiring the homeless prevention case manager. We're doing interviews. As for the numbers, we're getting a lot of calls for evictions and a little bit of utility turn-offs. I don't have in front of me, but we've been up to 50 women and children and the Safe Haven pilot.
- B. Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI)/Street Outreach: Jim Perlaki presented the CQI report for the month of November. Street outreach continues to do the work that they've been charged to do. We are 67% through the Fiscal year that encompasses the Street Outreach with CoC, and we're at 76% of the number of engagements up from last year. So, the number of engagements has continued to skyrocket. We're at 92% of the number of verifications being requested over last year. The problem with that 92 is last year we ended the year with 68% verified, and 32% were not. And so far at this point this year with 200 verification requests, we're at 50/50.
- C. Coordinated Entry System (CES): Eric Cooper reported the month of November was a steady month. CESA's were down by 20 in November compared to October. We sent out 23 referrals for Housing Opportunities this month. We do not expect an increase from the QBNL with the opening of the Warming Center.
- D. Interagency Service Team (IST): Erika Humphrey reported the IST report for the month of November. We met to discuss the housing crisis in Genesee County. We also added 2 people to the Moving-Up list. For our upcoming meetings we will resume collaborating with the CQI team at Street Outreach located at 1170 Robert T Longway 48503.

- E. **HMIS:** No report submitted. If there's any questions about HMIS, I can be contacted at TMcClain@metroflint.org.
- F. Supplemental Social Security Income & Social Security Disability Insurance Outreach Access and Recovery (SOAR): Bill Doub: We are in discussions right now with the Social Security Administration about changes and rules. Since the end of the pandemic. They are requesting now that they have wet signatures on documents. Prior to that we were allowed to fax documents, but now are required to have a 2nd witness. Then they call and verify the signature that that was, in fact, a wet signature. Be prepared for the next SOAR cohort training. It'll be coming up in January. I'll pass that announcement on when we receive it. Thank you very, very much for your support for SOAR.
- G. **Fiscal Reports:** The purpose of the Fiscal Workgroup is to review spending of agencies. The Fiscal Workgroup meetings are held via ZOOM on the 4th Thursday of each month at 10 Am.

Qualitative: barriers and solutions

A Barriers identified: Landlords.

- Solution: create a buy in for landlords to rent to our clients and hold them accountable for undesirable behavior.
- ➤ Host a breakfast for landlords with key members of the CoC, such as leadership, housing providers, city of Flint, law enforcement, LSEM, Landlord Association, and people with lived experience (actual renters).
- ➤ Panel discussion with landlords and CoC to discuss concerns, what is working/what is not working, changes that are needed, etc. Both sides would have space to voice their concerns. Sending a survey to landlords before breakfast meeting to identify their concerns ahead of time.
- ➤ Life skills for renters that might need additional services, offering peace of mind to LL knowing that their property will not be damaged. Examples: classes at St. Luke's for Warming Center participants, Vista Drop-In Center, case management, possible life skills group at GHS.
- Furniture and household items available for renters to also reduce damage to LL property. Examples: Catholic Charities, Crossover.
- ➤ Landlord concerns: not wanting "the government" involved with home inspections, renters with third party payers as a liability, late payments.
- Acknowledge concerns of landlords and address their needs so that everyone is happy.
- ❖ Any other agency at the table with updates Client Issues/Recommendations: discussed Emily's vulnerable client who has had multiple challenges at being housed for many years. Possible Rosewood Manor referral if client qualifies. Coordinate with Eric Cooper, CE Specialist, for possible re-referral.
- ❖ Other Business: E. Humphrey coordinated housing case managers prior to meeting via email regarding any PSH clients that were ready to Move Up. There are no clients to be referred at this time.
- ❖ Announcements: Next meeting will be in-person at Street Outreach office. This will be an in-person continuation of the IST and CQI collaboration. The groups will continue to discuss next steps to
